## SAMUEL ROSE PARKINSON

Samuel was born April 12, 1831 at Barrowford, England. As a child he was taken by parents to Australia, New Zealand and Chile, in search of better opportunity. They returned to England in 1845 and sailed for America in July 1848, arriving in New Orleans October 1st and then to St. Louis where he

was baptized in December. He came to Utah September 23, 1854 in William Field's company and settled in Kaysville. He was endowed and sealed to Arabella Ann Chandler November 16, 1855 in the Endowment House. He served in the "Echo Canyon War" of 1857 and in 1860 moved to Franklin, Idaho where he became a merchant and freighter. He was 1st Counselor to Bishop L. L. Hatch from 1878 to 1908 and on April 25, 1892 he was ordained a Patriarch by Joseph F. Smith and served in this office until his death May 23, 1919 in the influenza epidemic.

## ARABELLA ANN CHANDLER PARKINSON

Arabella was born Feb. 27, 1824 in Cheltenham, Gloucs. England, daughter of George Chandler and Esther Glover. She was baptized in March of 1844 in England and immigrated to St. Louis in 1851 where she met Samuel Rose Parkinson whom she married Jan. 1, 1852. Their first child, Samuel C. was born

in St. Louis before they emigrated to Utah in 1854. Four of her children were born in Kaysville, before their move to Franklin, Idaho in 1860 where the last four were born. She died August 9, 1894 and was buried August 12th in the Franklin Cemetery. Her son Albert died as a child but she reared eight children to maturity, four sons and four daughters. They inherited her fine qualities of industry and integrity and her love of the Gospel.
