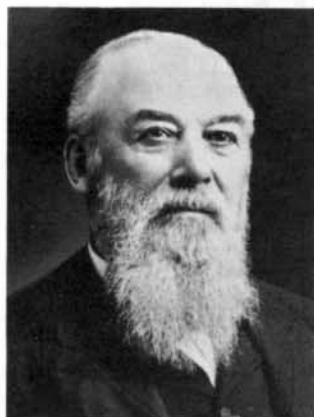

ARABELLA ANN CHANDLER was a convert from England who migrated to St. Louis, U.S.A. in 1851 with her parents — where she met Samuel Rose Parkinson. They crossed the plains two years later. In 1860 they were with the first company to settle Franklin, the oldest town in Idaho.

CHARLOTTE ELIZABETH SMART and MARIA SMART — (sisters) Both were born in St. Louis, Missouri and came to Utah in 1852, locating in American Fork, thence to Provo, where their father received a call from Presiding Bishop of the Church to move to Franklin, Idaho. He was Captain of the first settlers and counselor in Bishopric. Here the sisters met Samuel Rose Parkinson.

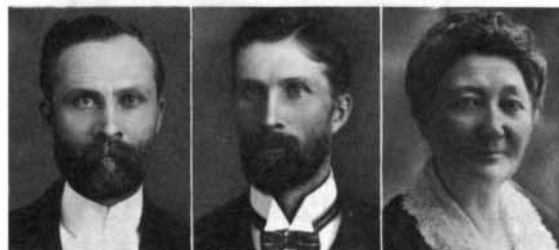
